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## From the Principal

**Dear Parents & Guardians** 

Womin-Jeka, Selemat Datang, Welcome to the 2018 school year. We have had a really smooth start with lots of excited students returning to school ready to learn and meet their teachers and friends. Our 68 new Prep students have simply been amazing. They are very settled and honestly look like they have been at school for a Term, as they are listening so well. Thank you to the parents who have trusted us to care for anyone who is upset at the beginning of the day. A quick hug, saying bye and walking away will always be harder for you as you cannot see how quickly (usually within seconds of being distracted), a child is smiling and joining their grade.

Our new classroom was handed over on the Wednesday prior to school commencing and this caused a ripple effect across the school for teachers who were waiting to set up their rooms much later than usual. I am very grateful for the hardworking staff I have at Wandin North. They were at school for countless hours over the holidays, including weekends, to organise their classrooms. Thank you also to the long-suffering fathers, mothers, boyfriends, fiancées, aunts, uncles, cousins and friends who are asked/told/conscripted/threatened/volunteered to help.

The focus for our first curriculum day for staff was on knowing what each student achieved in 2017 and their goals for 2018. We discussed what makes our school culture so strong and what we define as 'The Wandin North Way.' We reflected on our successes and areas of improvement as documented in our Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) which led to sharing ideas on how to improve attendance in 2018. Across the State, the average number of days absent for a student is 12. Anything below that is great and will result in students maximising the opportunities for learning both academically and socially. Anything above 12 days needs improvement. It is well proven that absenteeism can lead to a significant gap forming in academic outcomes and students not reaching their potential. Socially it is difficult to maintain friendships and of great interest is the fact that students with high absenteeism usually continue this pattern into Secondary School. In 2017 Grades 6 and 2 had the highest number of days absent and our Preps the lowest. We have a very large number of students who are picked up early from school which has the same impact as lateness/absenteeism in that important parts of the day are missed. In 2018 the DET has initiated new absenteeism regulations. On the day a student is absent parents are expected to notify the school. If parents fail to notify the school, we will initiate contact and request a reason why a child is absent from school. Our intention is to use both SMS and email communication to contact parents.

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Unapproved absences from school are a marker of low engagement and an early warning sign of students subsequently dropping out of education. We will be continually trying our best to engage children to want to come to school and need parent support to encourage their children to attend school every day. Unless a child is ill, reasons such as tiredness, birthdays, shopping, (the list is long) are not acceptable to be away from school. We intend to celebrate great attendance and promote why it is important so that we have the best chance to meet your child/rens potential.

We are expecting that our new playground equipment is installed in 2-3 weeks and we are also in the planning stages of building a dry creek bed with water play options inbuilt. The bush cubbies are being re-built by students and cricket is proving to be popular on the oval. It is great watching students find their 'piece' of the playground and happily play with their friends.

A reminder that our Meet and Greet is this Thursday. It is an opportunity for parents and teachers to discuss anything which may impact your child/rens learning and ensure a successful year. If families are unable to attend but would like to speak to their class teacher, please contact the office to arrange an alternative time.

### LATE PASSES AND ABSENCES –

DEECD accountability practices insist that every child is marked on the roll each day, both morning and afternoon.

Children must be signed in by their parents and obtain a yellow "late arrival" card from the office before going to the classroom.

Children must also be signed out if they are departing early.

Also, a reminder that all absences must be accounted for via a signed note from the parent explaining what date the child was absent and stating the reason why.

In the interest of every child's safety, we ask for your cooperation.

#### **VISITORS TO SCHOOL -**

All visitors, including parent helpers, are required to sign in and collect a 'VISITOR' badge at the office upon arrival. Please return the badge and enter the time when departing.

## Updating Information & Contact Details

We ask for you to update your address, phone & email contact details, student medical conditions, family living/custody arrangements, emergency contacts and occupation & employment status in accordance with DET requirements. All information is confidential and for school use only.

It is important to have the correct details on our system. Parents are asked to advise the school office in writing any time when any changes occur.

## Working With Children Checks (WWCC)

#### All volunteers helping in our school require a valid Working with Children Check.

If you have recently received your WWC Check card, remember to bring it to the office for registration.

Should you already hold a WWC Check card for another organisation you will not be required to apply for a new card, however you will need to advise the Department of Justice that you are now a volunteer at Wandin North Primary School. Please provide a copy of your card to the school office. We also require you to complete a 'Code Of Conduct' form.

This year, many existing WWC checks will be due for renewal. The expiry date is clearly marked on the front and back of your card. A renewal form will be posted to you by the Department of Justice approximately eight weeks before your card expires. ### Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF)

#### **CSEF Eliaibility:**

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;

Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR

Be a temporary foster parent, and;

Submit an application to the school by the due date.

\* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

**Eligibility Date:** For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (29 January 2018) or term two (16 April 2018).
