Literacy

In Reading, we have enjoyed studying the memoir Owl Moon with its beautiful description. Students have been using text connections, inferring character's thoughts and feelings, as well as creating and evaluating their predictions to get a deeper understanding of the book. We have enjoyed watching the student's understanding grow during the Term and they have created fantastic thinking spirals using text evidence to explain their thoughts about the story



In Writing, students have been using significant events in their life, from daring motorbike rides to family holidays, to write memorable memoirs. They have explored using Bold Beginnings, Mighty Middles and Excellent Endings, along with descriptive language to draw readers into their story. Students

have continued to build their use and knowledge of parts of speech and have especially enjoyed learning the verb, adverb and noun raps!

We encourage students to read nightly.

<u>Numeracy</u>

The 3/4 teachers think we might have some future designers on our hands, as the students explored redesigning the school by putting their multiplication and division skills to use in real-life situations! Students have also been learning more about chance, including expanding their ability to describe chance using different methods and correct vocabulary. Students have continued to hone their pattern finding skills when completing skip counting and multiplication practise: we encourage you to ask the students to show you some at home using their homework tasks!

Over the coming weeks, students will be exploring fractions, decimals and geometry.



Ski Trip

On Friday 27th July, 20 Grade 4 students and a brave Miss Hoehne travelled to Lake Mountain to spend the day learning how to ski. With many laughs, a few falls in the snow and one big snowball fight, everyone had a fantastic trip...even if there were a few sore muscles on Monday morning! Digital Technology

This Term students are exploring and developing their computer skills through coding. Students have begun to create their own block codes using the program Scratch, and will continue to develop their skills as the Term progresses.
