

It was great to see their understanding and appreciation grow for these ancient artworks as I heard them exclaim, "Mrs Bailey, this is really difficult," "This is much harder than I expected and "Wow! The indigenous people were very skilled to use these materials and still be able to create great artworks." Yet after many struggles and a lot of MESS our students also created some Indigenous inspired masterpieces!
