Already we are in Week 7 of Term 2!

Students in **Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2** really enjoyed creating their **Snake Art**, by using **Aboriginal symbols**. Most of these were displayed at our Open Night on Wednesday 22nd of May.

The theme of our **Open Night** was STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art Show and Mathematics). In the Global Room, Students enjoyed making catapults, and launching mini marshmallows!

The **Grades Prep to 2** will continue now in understanding the **Dreamtime**. They will sequence some **Dreamtime stories** and learn about the **importance of them in Indigenous culture and history**.

The **Grades 3-6** have had a busy few weeks, but really enjoyed making **Damper** recently in Global. They were able to work in small groups and use basic ingredients: flour, water, margarine and salt. Although Damper is traditionally made on a camp fire, students were still able to create it using our School ovens.

FUN FACT: DID YOU KNOW? ...

Damper was originally made by Indigenous Australians using Spinifex seeds, where they baked the dough in the coals of a fire.

Last week was National Reconciliation Week (27th May—3rd June). National Reconciliation Week is a time for Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements, and how we can now contribute to reconciliation ('the action of making one view or belief compatible with another'). Students in Grades F-2 coloured in a hand and explained why they chose the colours. In grades 3-6 students looked at Kevin Rudd's apology and worked in small groups to understand the Stolen Generations Poetry.
