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# From the Principal

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Whole School Attendance-Our goal is 3 days or less for each school Term and less than 12 days for the year.

Dear Parents & Guardians,

The Prep students are leading the way their attendance and are tracking below 3 days per term and well below the 12 day per student goal for the year, currently on 8 days. Keep aiming high! The 1/2 students are tracking to meet our target also. Well done Junior school. We encourage parents/guardians to continue to send students to school right up until the final day as, despite rumours to the contrary, we are teaching and learning for the entire term. It would be fantastic if we reach our goal of averaging 12 days or less as a whole school.

We are very grateful to have Caroline back running a berry stall each Friday at assembly from 3:00-4:00ish or until sold out. Caroline kindly donates her time and profits back to the school. Last year's berry sales enabled the purchase of our planter boxes in front of the Prep/1 building. Caroline has set up for EFTPOS or cash payment.

This term there is a lot happening across all year levels with sport days for Prep to Grade 2 and Summer Sports round robin for Grades 5/6, Grade 2 camp, Grade 3/4 excursion to the Arts Centre, Prep incursion and that is just in November! I strongly encourage families to continue to read the Weekly News as it will have all of the dates for the upcoming events.

At Wandin North P.S. we strive to make strong connections with our extended community. An example of this has been our relationship with the Wandin CFA. Wandin North P.S. is a BARR (Bushfire At Risk School) and both fire and emergency incident drills are held each term. Towards the end of last term we conducted an internal evacuation drill with members from the Wandin CFA on site to observe our processes. It was great to have Peter Story present to the students at assembly and discuss the importance of having a fire safety plan. On Friday the 22nd of November, straight after assembly, we will have Peter here again provided a community information for families on how to best prepare for the upcoming fire season. I would like to extend a big thank you from the students to Wandin Rotary. Rotary kindly donated 25 lighted microscopes last Friday at assembly. The students will put the microscopes to good use during Inquiry and Science units to increase their curiosity and discover new learnings.

### Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF)

We are pleased to advise that the Camps, Sports and Excursion Funds (CSEF) will once again be available to eligible families. Forms and information are available from the front office.

Eligible families can access \$125 per student for the 2020 year.

Who Can apply:

Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply. There are 2 criteria's that must be met:

Criteria 1:

Eligible families must have cards active on the first day of term one (29 January 2019) or the first day of term two (23 April 2019), a parent or legal guardian of a student must:

be an eligible beneficiary of one of these cards:

Veterans Affairs Gold Card

Centrelink Health Care Card

Pensioner Concession Card

OR they must be a temporary foster parent

OR the student is 16 years or older and holds a valid concession card (such as a Youth Allowance Health Care Card)

AND the parent or legal guardian must submit an application by the due date.

Parents who receive a carer allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Eligibility will be determined when the parent's concession card successfully validates with Centrelink on either the first day of term one or term two.

If the eligible card is in the name of the student, the fund is only granted to that student, not their siblings. *Criteria 2:* 

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years.

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, TAFE or who are home schooled.

If you are eligible, please complete the application form, together with a copy of your current card (proof that it is valid on the required date/s). All forms must be in by the school by March 2020.

We ask that parents check what year level groups they are connected to so we can ensure that important messages are received from Wandin North Primary School staff. Please add or delete groups if necessary to reflect the year levels of your child/ren.

**ABSENCE NOTIFICATIONS :** Absence notifications are sent via FlexiBuzz. If you receive a message, please respond via FLEXIBUZZ to your child's class teacher.

**EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS :** In the event of an emergency situation, families will be notified by a FLEXIBUZZ message. It is essential that all families have joined and their contact phone numbers are up to date.

**Special Mention!** I would like to extend a huge thank you to Grover Love, who has spent almost the whole of Term 3 developing an orienteering course for the grade 3-6 students. You may have seen Grover surveying the school grounds with his clipboard working out the landmarks and key structures of our facilities. Essentially what Grover has done is work out the exact measurements of those structures and mapped them out onto a computer program which generally takes hours of painstaking work to draw. From this I was able to create an orienteering map for all year levels as well as a challenge course for the students to practice for their upcoming orienteering competition. As mentioned above, the amount of detailed work that goes into creating a map would generally cost hundreds if not thousands of dollars. However, Grover has given the school these maps free or charge. As a result of Grover's generous time and effort in creating these maps, the children and I are very grateful for having him as part of our parent community.

Active Lunch Program : A couple of Fridays ago at assembly, the school captains talked about a special initiative to engage all the students in our school into being more physically active. As a result, the house and school captains have come up with an 'Active Lunch' program that will be run every Thursday, where they will run a range of team orientated games, for example; basketball, cricket, capture the flag and more. On Thursday 24th October, we had our first taste of the program that was successfully run by our amazing house and school captains. I am pleased to say that the feedback received from the teachers and students have been overwhelmingly positive and we will continue to deliver the program every Thursday until the end of Term. I loved seeing the younger students engage with the older students and the older students teaching and supporting the younger students. ### Working With Children Checks (WWCC) <u>And</u> Code Of Conduct

### All volunteers helping in our school require a valid Working With Children Check.

If you have recently received your WWCC card, remember to bring it to the office for registration.

Should you already hold a WWCC card for another organisation you will not be required to apply for a new card, however you will need to advise the Department of Justice that you are now a volunteer at Wandin North Primary School. Please provide a copy of your card to the school office. We also require you to complete a 'Code Of Conduct' form.

This year, many existing WWCC's will be due for renewal. The expiry date is clearly marked on the front and back of your card. A renewal form will be posted to you by the Department of Justice approximately eight weeks before your card expires.
