Let's get our learning on! We have hit the ground running with new topics being explored at the start of this term. Students have settled back into the Indonesian room well and are enjoying seeing Ibu Flowers again in person (rather than only onscreen for several months!).



Prep and Grade 1

students are focusing their learning on fruits and vegetables. They are getting familiar with pronouncing their names in Indonesian, and finding out where and how they grow. Students have shared their likes and dislikes for particular fruits and vegetables, as well as surveying others in their class to find out more information about them. We're having lots of fun sharing these facts and getting to know each other better!



Grade 2 students are getting familiar with classroom objects in Indonesian. They are learning the new vocabulary and practising their knowledge each lesson. Students have participated in a scavenger hunt to compare objects found in the Indonesian room. We will expand our learning by looking at Indonesian schools and comparing and contrasting them to schools in Australia.



Grade 3 and 4 and Grade 5 and 6

students have been getting reacquainted with their common greetings in Indonesian. They have been very creative completing comic strips

showing conversations between characters.

Students have also interviewed others in their class, sharing random facts about themselves such as their birthdays, hobbies, people in their family, and if they have pets.



I am so proud of all of my amazing students at Wandin North Primary School. Their continued eagerness and willingness to learn about Indonesia's language and culture is truly special. I can't wait to see what our final term in 2020 has in store for us!
