# Readers Workshop

Students have been focusing on persuasive texts over the past few of weeks.

They have explored 'Be a Friend to Trees' by Patricia Lauber, 'Give Bees a Chance' by Bethany Barton and 'Escargot' by Dashka Slater. Whilst reading the texts, they focused on using multiple strategies to help them have a deeper understanding of what the author was telling them. Students enjoyed making text to world connections, synthesising (how their thinking grows and changes), analysing why the author used certain

text features and critiquing each text. Students were great at stating what the liked or disliked about a certain text and provided reasons why.



### Writers Workshop

The students have been busy over the past few weeks writing their persuasive pieces. They explored environmental issues and students chose a topic that they thought was important. Some of the topics students chose were Stop Cutting Down Trees, Leave Nature Alone, Stop Littering and the list goes on. They developed their opinion on the



issue, developed 3 arguments why people should or shouldn't do something and provided evidence to support their arguments. Students also learnt about a range of persuasive techniques like rhetorical questions and alliteration. They are very excited to share their published pieces with you.

## Maths

Over the past 2 weeks, students have been working very hard to develop their knowledge and understanding on the mass of objects and money.

Students were thoroughly engaged when they were provided with the opportunity to use balancing scales and digital scales to weigh objects around the room. They learnt about informal units, formal units (g.kg) and why it is important to have formal units to use when weighing things in our daily lives.



Students did an amazing job during our Money unit. They practised counting collections of coins and adding 2 or more amounts together. Some students went a step further and learnt multiple strategies to help them work out the change from a financial transaction. Next time

you are at the shop, ask your 🄉 child to count the coins in your wallet and pay for the item. There is nothing better than applying their learning in real life situations.
