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From the Principal

Dear Parents & Guardians.

It was an absolute pleasure to see all of the student's expressions and reactions to commencing school last week. We welcomed 43 new Foundation students on Thursday. I can appreciate the roller coaster of emotions our new families felt on the first drop off, as I too was dropping my son to school for the first time. Upon my return to school just after the bell, all Preps were settling in to their new learning environment. It always takes a few weeks for all children to settle back into our school routine so expect a variety of emotions and tiredness over the coming weeks. All of our gorgeous Grade 6 buddies were looking a little puffed and tired on last Thursday trying to keep up as their buddies were eagerly running to all areas of the school yard.

Leigh and I visited all grades and it is always reassuring at how settled and calm our children are. Before students commenced school, all staff attended a curriculum day which focused on our whole school agreements, behaviour management, our goals and targets in addition to personal goals.

Our school has commenced with 323 students and 15 Grades which is almost at our maximum capacity. In order to ensure places for siblings of existing families and to help determine the number of places we have for 2022, we ask that parents contact the office to let us know if you a have child commencing school next year. We will be opening up the top gate again for suitable vehicles to park and pick up their children. Please be aware that this area does not have parking signage/structure and there are several mounds, potholes, stumps and sticks to navigate. Drivers who elect to use this area, do so at their own risk. Parking is NOT permitted directly in front of the basketball court fence or in front of the playground equipment as we do not want drivers reversing to exit the grounds. Parents are asked to park in any area beyond the playground equipment. We will inform students they are NOT to play in cubbies or on the top playground before or after school. We hope this assists the situation and appreciate driver patience and support.

I hope parents/guardians have received notifications and emails to set up a Compass account. We have made the move from Flexischools to Compass. Compass will be our communications platform and we will not be using or checking Flexischools moving forward.

We look forward to our year level information sessions for parents this week. These will be starting at 3:45pm on the following days. Monday Grade 3/4 in 3/4B, Tuesday Grade 5/6 in 5/6A, Wednesday Grade 1/2 in 1/2J and Thursday Preps in Prep S. Staff will be meeting parents/guardians at our Meet and Greets on Thursday 11th of February. We will be attempting to use the interview booking system via Compass for parents to book a time to meet with your child's teacher. More information to come out shortly.

I am very excited to announce that Wandin North was successful in securing a minor capital works grant from the Department of Education at the end of 2020. The application we put together is to revamp our assembly area to include putting synthetic turf across the entire asphalted area with down ball squares, a basketball key and hopscotch. The assembly area will have a shaded water proof membrane structure to protect the students and families from weather for assemblies, Physical Education lessons and outside learning. We expect the project to be completed by October 2021.



Over the holiday break we had bush fire prevention works carried out which resulted in a number of trees being cut. We still have wood available for parents who wish. We ask a donation to be made to the school per trailer load. Please contact the office for more details.

Lastly, it is all systems go for Harvest Market which is on Sunday 21st of March this year. I will be putting out a meeting schedule for stall coordinators and all parents who wish to attend. For new families, the Harvest Market is our major fundraiser and it takes the whole school community to make it the event it is. Stay tuned to the meeting schedule and parent roster in the coming days.

I look forward to meeting our new families across the year and saying hello to our returning ones. I know that 2021 is going to be our best yet.

Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF)

CSEF (Camps, Sports and Excursion funds) - Applications due by Monday 15th FEBRUARY 2021

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is: \$125 for primary school students

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

Application forms (together with a copy of your current health care card) MUST be given to the school office no later than MONDAY 15th FEBRUARY 2021

<u>Eligibility</u> To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

on the first day of Term one or on the first day of Term two.

Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR Be a temporary foster parent, and;

Submit an application to the school by the due date.

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Be of school age and attend school in Victoria School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive. For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

<u>Eligibility Date</u> For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (27th January 2021) or term two (19th April 2021).

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
