WHAT'S ON IN Indonesian

Students from Wandin North Primary School recently celebrated Hari Kemerdekaan (Indonesian Independence Day). During the week of August 17

our beautiful students immersed themselves in this special day by participating in various activities at home or at school. It was amazing to see the children so involved in the festivities and having so much fun!

Prep students have begun learning about animals found in Indonesia this Term. They have listened to new songs and have practised reading aloud

the names of different animals from a non-fiction text. The Preps are currently learning to describe animals using adjectives such as size and colour.

The Grade 1 and 2 students are focusing on their daily routines. They have become familiar with saying different times in Indonesian and the days of the week from a text called 'Bangun Bambang' (Wake Up Bambang). The students have listened to new songs that highlight these topics which I hope they have found enjoyable

and memorable.













Our Grade 3 and 4 students have been further developing their skills in reading Indonesian sentences. The text, 'Si Gajah Kecil Merasa Haus' (The Little Thirsty Elephant), has been our focus for the remainder of this Term. Students are learning about Indonesian word order and have answered questions about the text to show their understanding.



The Grade 5 and 6 students are

applying their knowledge of key words to predict meaning and translate words from a new text, about village life on the island of Sulawesi. They have expanded their vocabulary and have compared factual information about themselves and their daily lives.
