<u>Literacy</u>

We kicked off our Term 4 Literacy unit by studying

poetry using the texts, Sigmond Sliterforth by Hayley MacDuff and Rosie Revere, Engineer by Andrea Beaty. The students learnt about topics such as, different poetry structures, the importance of word choice and how authors use poetry to share a message.



We have recently completed a unit on persuasive writing and studied the Greenpeace article, 'What if we

treated the oceans like they matter?". It has been a wonderful article to analyse and the students have explored how an author creates a convincing persuasive piece of writing. Students have worked on identifying the author's purpose in various texts and inferred the feelings the author wanted the reader to experience.

In the last three weeks of Term, we are investigating letters. Students will be writing a letter to their future teacher to tell them about all of their amazing qualities and to express how they are feeling about 2022.
