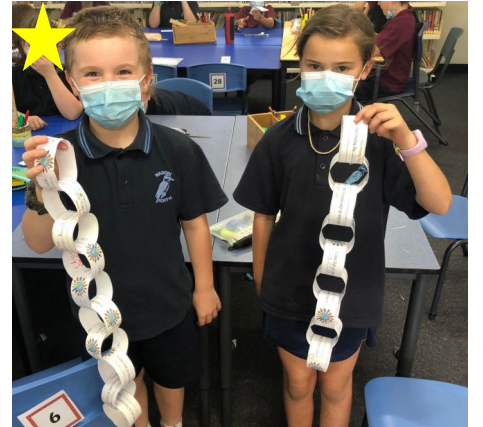


# WHAT'S ON IN INDONESIAN

## Term 1 - March

Monday 21st March was **Harmony Day**, a day that celebrates Australia's cultural diversity. It is a time for us to remember and respect our diverse cultural backgrounds and to share what we have in common. In our Indonesian lessons, students participated in various activities to celebrate Harmony Day. They made Indigenous Australian-themed collages; Harmony Day postage stamps; drew pictures of their favourite international foods; and created paper chain links with peaceful messages. Students in Grade 3 and 4 sampled Indonesian snacks called 'Momogi' (moh-moh-ghee), which are similar in taste to Cheezels. Most kids agreed they were 'enak' (tasty).

**Grade 1 and 2** students have been busy focusing on the seasons and learning how to describe weather.



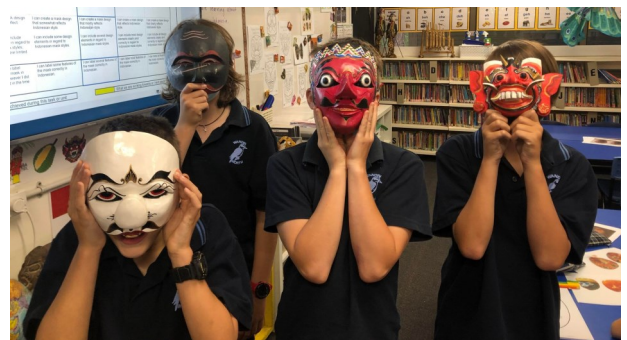
## Tentang Saya
