

WHAT'S ON IN INDONESIAN

Term 3: Juli - Agustus

We have had a fantastic start to Indonesian in Term 3. We are in for a busy couple of weeks, with a few surprises in store the week of Wednesday 17th August—the 77th Indonesian Independence Day / Hari Kemerdekaan.



Klub Bahasa Indonesia

We will be starting an Indonesian Club / Klub Bahasa Indonesia that will run from 11.10am—11.30am every Tuesday. Our amazing Captains will help host these sessions between the junior and senior school. Students will have the chance to work on their speaking and writing skills. We can't wait to see them there!

'Di Mana Harimau?'

Our **Prep students** have been focussing on the story, 'Di Mana Harimau?' (Where is Tiger?). They have had lots of fun seeing the locations Harimau has visited and what activities he's done. The students have been learning about other Indonesian animals too, such as the orangutan and komodo dragon.



Besar dan Kecil

Grade 1 and 2 have been learning Indonesian adjectives, in particular, *besar* (big) dan (and) *kecil* (pronounced 'kuh-chill', meaning, small). They have sorted items such as fruits according to size, and will continue familiarising themselves with other adjectives throughout the term.



Kuda Lumping (Flat Horse)

In the lead up to Independence Day, our **Grade 3 and 4** students have learnt about 'Kuda Lumping', a traditional Javanese dance that uses flat horse props. The dance is performed during special ceremonies such as festivals,

marriages and birthdays. Students are creating their own Kuda Lumping designs in class.



Rupiah

Students in **Grade 5 and 6** have begun learning facts about the Indonesian Rupiah. They have compared Indonesia's

currency to the Australian dollar and have revised their knowledge of higher numbers (Rupiah goes up to the thousands!). Students will be exploring the topic, 'Warung' (wah-rooh-ng), which translates to café, later this term.
