What's on in Year 5/6? December 2022!

Reading

At the beginning of Term 4, we had a strong focus on our mentor text 'The Travel Book' where we explored many countries across the world. We learnt about significant details about the country, including the population, currency, capital, neighbouring countries and cultural, social and historical details.

Recently in Reading, students have been exploring a variety of Poems. We have particularly focused on two poems, 'From Little Things Big Things Grow' by Paul Kelly and 'Little Things' by Ziggy Ramo. We used these poems as our mentor text and learnt about key parts of Australian History including the Gurindji Strike (Wave hill walk-off) and the Indigenous land rights movement.

In the coming weeks, we will be exploring a number of other poetic mentor texts for students to use as inspiration to create their own poems in Writing.

Writing

In Writing, we have been working hard on Captain Speech applications and Graduation Speeches. Students have really enjoyed writing these, reflecting on themselves and their previous years of schooling at WNPS. Recently, we have moved into a poetry unit where we have been experimenting with writing different types of poems to engage our audience. Using 'From Little Things Big Things Grow' as inspiration, students are creating various free verse poems. Towards the end of the term, students will be working collaboratively with peers and write poems together.

Inquiry

Our Term 4 Inquiry focus has been on Geography. This unit has built upon the knowledge students gained from studying our mentor text 'The Travel Book' at the beginning of the Term. Students have been investigating topography and the importance of topographic maps. We have also learnt about our continents where students explored a particular continent in a small group and created a presentation to share with their peers. In addition to this, we explored longitude and latitude, the significance of the equator and the Northern and Southern Hemisphere.

Towards the end of term, students will begin presenting their Homework projects on their chosen country.

Numeracy

Recently in Numeracy, we have been practising our Using Units of Measurement skills and focusing on Perimeter, Area, Volume, Capacity, Length and Mass! We have learnt about our common units and how to convert between these. This week, we have been exploring time, converting 12– and 24– hour time and strategies to calculate elapsed time. Students have starting a Around the World Project where they have been investigating flights across the world, departing and arrive times, flight duration, cost and more. In the coming weeks, we will be creating a Around the World travel game board where students will play with their peers and practise their Time skills.
