PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE : Dear Families

A warm welcome back to everyone. The first day of the school year is exciting but can also be a nervous and anxious time for students and parents. Our Preps have been amazing during their first day of school. They have all settled quickly into classroom routines and have had fun running their buddies around at play times. During my walk around into classrooms after lunch I could see all classes setting up their classroom norms, children interacting freely with their new classmates and lots of smiles on faces.

During this week we have our year level parent information sessions. We have staggered the year levels throughout the week to allow families who have multiple children at school to attend. Our first session is Grade 3/4 in Ms Burrow's classroom today straight after school. Please check Compass calendar and news feed to see when your child's information session is.

Student attendance will be a big focus in 2023. Our aim to is have all students at school every day. Missing one day a fortnight is the same as missing 4 whole weeks of a school year. In the event your child is unwell and will not be attending school, it is encouraged to put an attendance note on Compass to ensure the absence is explained. If the absence is unexplained, a SMS message will be sent out and then a follow up phone call will be made if an absent note as not been put on Compass. A reminder that in Terms 1 and 4 students are required to wear a school sunsmart hat. If you are unable to locate your child's hat, they are available to purchase at the office for \$12 cash. All students are required to have their hats by Wednesday.

<u>Camps/ Sports / Excursions Funds (CSEF)</u>

Eligible families are reminded that applications for CSEF are now open. Please ensure you read the following information and visit the school office with a copy of your current card, and complete the CSEF application form which is available at the office.

It would be greatly appreciated if forms could be completed and submitted as soon as possible to ensure the funds are deposited to your child's account in a timely manner to use on eligible activities for 2023. This is also to ensure you don't miss the cut off date set by DET.

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF). Criteria 1 – General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one
- on the first day of Term two

a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent, and;

b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy: https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/camps-sports-and-excursions-fund/policy

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary

school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE. Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

§ Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families § Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully

with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (30 January 2023) or term two (24 April 2023).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

• Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

Please visit the school office for a form.

When completing the form, ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

You need to ensure that you complete the following:

1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card

to the school.

If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.

2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.

3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.
