Curriculum Day No Students At School

From the Principal

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Wominjeka, Selemat Datang, Welcome. Our new Prep students have simply been amazing. They are very settled and honestly look like they have been at school for a Term, as they are listening so well and beginning to master the routines of school. Thank you to the parents who have trusted us to care for anyone who is upset at the beginning of the day. A quick hug, saying bye and walking away will always be harder for you as you cannot see how quickly (usually within seconds of being distracted), a child is smiling and joining their grade.

We had great attendance to our year level information sessions last week. We hope the sessions were informative with what to expect throughout the year, key dates and how you can best support your child with their learning and wellbeing throughout 2023. If you were unable to attend, the information presented has been posted on Compass.

As mentioned in the information sessions and my piece last week, student attendance will be focus in 2023. Across the State, the average number of days absent for a student is 12. Anything below that is great and will result in students maximising the opportunities for learning both academically and socially. Anything above 12 days needs improvement. It is well proven that absenteeism can lead to a significant gap forming in academic outcomes and students not reaching their potential. Socially it is difficult to maintain friendships and of great interest is the fact that students with high absenteeism usually continue this pattern into Secondary School.

NAPLAN has now been bought forward in 2023 and the testing window starts on the 15th March for years 3 and 5. Mr Hallett will be sending out information via Compass in the coming weeks about NAPLAN. NAPLAN is a snap shot and is one test at one time. Our processes and whole school approaches compliment the NAPLAN testing, resulting in above State and National outcomes. If there are concerns regarding your child sitting NAPLAN or you would like more information, please see your classroom teacher or Mr Hallett and myself.

Harvest Market is fast approaching and now that the sign is up on the highway it is great reminder that it is on Sunday 19th of March 9am – 2pm. The Harvest Market has been running for over 20 years. It is a major community event and our major fundraiser.

Last year we raised over \$35,000 which helps to finance our digital devices. The money raised this year is going towards the upgrade of our assembly area. Harvest Market is not a success without our parents. We will be holding a Harvest Market via Google Meet this Thursday 9th February at 5pm. All are welcome to attend. Version 1 of the stall roster will be coming out shortly.

A reminder that our Meet and Greet is this Thursday. It is an opportunity for parents and teachers to discuss anything which may impact your child/rens learning and ensure a successful year. If families are unable to attend but would like to speak to their class teacher, please email for class teacher via Compass to arrange a time.

Lastly, we are currently taking school tours for 2024 and 2025 Preps. If you are aware of families who are thinking of sending their child to Wandin North, we would love to have them, please encourage the families to book a tour via our website or call the office.

Compass : Student Absence Notifications

All student absences must be explained by parents using Compass.

Parents are asked to please ensure that the <u>correct date and</u> <u>time</u> frame is selected when sending absence notifications. Compass has two sessions : AM (9:00am - 12:00pm) and PM (12:30pm - 3:30pm).

Please be careful with selecting the appropriate dates and times for the duration of your child's absence.

Compass : Late Arrivals & Early Departures

All students must be signed in and out by parents at the office using the Compass 'Kiosk' (iPad). This will automatically update class rolls.

Late students need to obtain a 'Late Pass' upon arrival. Students being collected early will be called to the office by staff where they will be collected by parents/carers. Parents are not to go directly to the classroom unless requested by staff.

Phone Messages To Parents

Parents are asked to check their messages if they receive a 'missed call' before they contact the school as a response is not always required.

Working With Children Checks (WWCC) <u>And</u> Code Of Conduct

All volunteers helping in our school require a valid Working With Children Check.

If you have recently received your WWCC card, remember to bring it to the office for registration.

Should you already hold a WWCC card for another organisation you will not be required to apply for a new card, however you will need to advise the Department of Justice that you are now a volunteer at Wandin North Primary School. Please provide a copy of your card to the school office. We also require you to complete a 'Code Of Conduct' form.

This year, many existing WWCC's will be due for renewal. The expiry date is clearly marked on the front and back of your card. A renewal form will be posted to you by the Department of Justice approximately eight weeks before your card expires. Applications must be made online at http://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/home/applications/

We also require you to complete a 'Code Of Conduct' form before you are able to assist with activities. If you have not yet done so, please collect a form from the office staff.

CSEF / CREDIT ON ACCOUNTS - If you have a credit or unused CSEF (Camp, Sports and Excursion Funds) on your account, we please ask that this be used first, prior to paying for any additional event costings. Please be reminded that CSEF funds can't be used for School fees, Grade 6 graduation or School Uniforms. If you are unsure of the amount of credit or CSEF that you have, please email the school asking for a copy of your statement.

STATEMENTS - You can request a statement at any time. Please contact the office if you require one. Email <u>wandin.north.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> to request a copy.

CSEF - Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund

Eligible families are reminded that applications for CSEF are now open. Please ensure you read the following information and visit the school office with a copy of your current card, and complete the CSEF application form which is available at the office. It would be greatly appreciated if forms could be completed and submitted as soon as possible to ensure the funds are deposited to your child's account in a timely manner to use on eligible activities for 2023. This is also to ensure you don't miss the cut off date set by DET. If you have any queries, please come and see Rachael at the school office.

CSEF ELIGIBILITY— Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – General eligibility - To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must: • on the first day of Term one • on the first day of Term two a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent, and; b) submit an application to the school by the due date. For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy: <u>https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/camps-sports-and-excursions-fund/policy</u>

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above. Criteria 2— Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE. Special Consideration—A special consideration category exists for § Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families § Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care. Eligibility Date— For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (30 January 2023) or term two (24 April 2023).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS— The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student. • Primary school student rate: \$125 per year. The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM— Please visit the school office for a form.

When completing the form, ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

You need to ensure that you complete the following:

1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section. Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school. If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.

2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.

3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.
