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

Compass: Student Absence Notifications

All student absences must be explained by parents using Compass.

Parents are asked to please ensure that the <u>correct date and time</u> frame is selected when sending absence notifications. Compass has two sessions: AM (9:00am - 12:00pm) and PM (12:30pm - 3:30pm).

Please be careful with selecting the appropriate dates and times for the duration of your child's absence.



Compass: Late Arrivals & Early Departures

All students must be signed in and out by parents at the office using the Compass 'Kiosk' (iPad). This will automatically update class rolls.

Late students need to obtain a 'Late Pass' upon arrival. Students being collected early will be called to the office by staff where they will be collected by parents/carers. Parents are not to go directly to the classroom unless requested by staff.

Lunch Orders

Lunch Order Packs now cost \$8:00 **each.** Additional items can be purchased at an extra cost. Paper bags and zip lock coin bags are available from the office foyer.

<u>Please write all details on the bag</u> (name, grade, food/drink items and amount), place cash into the zip lock bag and place in order bag.

No staples please!

These are to be handed into the classroom Tuesday mornings and orders will be delivered on Thursdays. No late orders are to be taken directly to Mr K's.

2024 Prep Enrolments

We request that parents with children starting school in 2024 notify the office and submit an enrolment form as soon as possible. Please include copies of your child's Birth Certificate and up-to-date Immunisation Statement. This will greatly assist us with ensuring you receive important information relating to your child's transition to school.

Phone Messages To Parents

We are aware that parents are not always able to answer the phone during the day when we try to contact them and where possible we will leave a detailed message.

Parents are asked to check their messages if they receive a 'missed call' before they contact the school as a response is not always

Updating Information & Contact Details

It is essential to have the correct details on our system and Compass.

We ask for you to update your address, phone & email contact details, student medical conditions, family living/custody arrangements, emergency contacts and occupation & employment status in accordance with DET requirements. All information is confidential and for school use only.

Parents are asked to advise the school office in writing any time when any changes occur.

Working With Children Checks (WWCC) <u>And</u> Code Of Conduct

All volunteers helping in our school require a valid Working With Children Check.

If you have recently received your WWCC card, remember to bring it to the office for registration.

Should you already hold a WWCC card for another organisation you will not be required to apply for a new card, however you will need to advise the Department of Justice that you are now a volunteer at Wandin North Primary School. Please provide a copy of your card to the school office. We also require you to complete a 'Code Of Conduct' form.

This year, many existing WWCC's will be due for renewal. The expiry date is clearly marked on the front and back of your card. A renewal form will be posted to you by the Department of Justice approximately eight weeks before your card expires. Applications must be made online at http://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/home/applications/

We also require you to complete a 'Code Of Conduct' form before you are able to assist with activities. If you have not yet done so, please collect a form from the office staff.
