READING & WRITING

In Literacy this Term, we have started analysing letters. Students have read 'The Day The Crayons Quit' and have examined the different voices and purposes present within informal letters. Students have also begun comprehending hand written letters by J.R.R Tolkien from the 1940s, analysing the complex and formal language used.

Students have furthered their writing skills by writing a range of letters with different purposes. The 5/6s wrote letters to local companies and big businesses, trying to obtain resources to benefit W.N.P.S. They have also begun publishing persuasive donation letters for 'Bizarre Bazaar' which they will personally hand deliver in the hopes of having items donated for their stalls.

NUMERACY

In Numeracy, students have been revisiting fractions, decimals and percentages. They have practised putting numbers on number lines and ensuring they are correctly positioned. We will now move into our money unit, preparing us to understand budgets and change calculations so we can be successful business owners during 'Bizarre Bazaar.'
