

Readers Workshop

We began the month analysing our fiction mentor text Walk of the Whales by Nick Bland, before moving onto our next

non-fiction text Water: Protect Freshwater to Save Life on Earth by Catherine Barr & Christine Engel. This persuasive text led us to help summarise the text by focusing on what was important, rather than what we found interesting. We used the feature of the headings to help us focus on the main parts.



We the moved onto analysing again but with multiple nonfiction texts, including Be a friend to Trees by Patricia Lauber and Minibeasts by Kingfisher Readers. Once again we focused on the print features but this time with non-fiction, including:

Finishing our Narratives, we incorporated our special visitors from Sustainability/H.E.R.O.E.S into our stories, protecting the Earth. We focused on editing, making sure we were using our capital letters and full stops, but also building a great story with strong characters.

We then dived into Persuasive writing using our mentor text, Water: Protect Freshwater to Save Life on Earth by Catherine Barr & Christine Engel. We chose our opinion again from the Environment and used arguments and evidence to persuade our Grade 1 audience why we need to protect our planet.

Maths

We began the month by learning about measuring Mass. The students loved using the balances scales and weights to measure classroom items. The students showed how much their understanding of the topics we've covered this Semester has grown by completing different

Essential Assessment tasks.

During the assessments we revisited Time by reading and making time on both analogue and digital clocks. We then revisited our 4 number process of: Addition, Subtraction, Division and Multiplication. The stu-



dents loved showing their understanding of the different strategies including using number lines and fact families.
