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## From the Principal

Dear Parents/Guardians.

It's hard to believe that we are so close to the end of Semester One! It has been another big first half of the year. Students' mid-year results across our school are trending exceptionally well. There is a high proportion of students who have achieved great growth across all areas of

the curriculum. The introduction of our systematic synthetic phonics

approach in Prep – 2 has promoted a consistent approach to teaching of phonics and phonemic awareness. Students in our junior classes routinely spend the first 25 minutes of each day explicitly learning the relationship between sounds and letter to read words. This shift in practice has complemented our existing Literacy practices.

Show Respect



The *Children's Wellbeing Continuum* can provide a snapshot of a child's social-emotional wellbeing at a point in time.

By helping to identify those children who are struggling and need support, the continuum assists with prevention and early intervention efforts.

It may also help to prevent the development of more serious problems that need treatment.

The Continuum is designed to reduce the stigma that often accompanies mental health issues, especially for parents, and facilitate them seeking help early when they see their child is not coping.

Empathy is the ability to understand and share the feelings of others—an essential skill for fostering kindness, connection, and resilience in


children. At our school, we nurture empathy through The Resilience Project (TRP), a wellbeing program grounded in the principles of Gratitude, Empathy, and Mindfulness (GEM).

Each week, students engage in interactive lessons and reflective journal activities that help them:

- Recognise and understand emotions in themselves and others
- Develop compassion and kindness through storytelling and discussion
- Practice perspective-taking to build stronger peer relationships

This approach not only supports emotional literacy but also contributes to a more connected and supportive classroom environment.

Try some of the Empathy ideas on the picture on the right at home to foster Empathy in your family at home, too. Together, we aim to cultivate a community where empathy is practiced daily, laying the foundation for resilient and compassionate individuals.

## **Updated RRRR Resources for 2025**

This Friday, Respectful Relationship Team Members will be attending a professional learning webinar on the updated *Respectful Relationships* teaching resources for 2024. These refreshed materials continue to support the development of social and emotional skills in our primary students, with a strong focus on topics such as emotional literacy, respectful friendships, problem-solving, and gender equality.

New content has also been introduced to help students understand and respond to online influences, recognise coercive or disrespectful behaviours, and build respectful connections both in person and online. Throughout the year, I will be sharing this learning with our staff to ensure these important concepts are embedded in our teaching and across our school culture.

We remain committed to fostering a safe, inclusive, and respectful environment for all children.



## What's On in Prep

July 2025

We're approaching the end of term, and feeling very accomplished with our achievements. We are so proud of how hard all our Prep children have been working. You are truly superstars!!

**Literacy:** In Reading, we have now learnt all of the letters of the alphabet. Each week in Reading, we are looking at different comprehension strategies when exploring our mentor texts. Below are some question examples you may use after reading with your child.

- What do you think will happen at the end of the story?
- How does something in this book remind you of something in your life?
- What do you already know about this topic?
- What did you think of the book?
- What happened in the book?

At the end of the term, your child will bring home a plastic pocket folder with their alphabet posters.

They all worked very hard on each poster and will be excited to share this with you!

In Writing, we have continued to focus on the foundation of writing including: capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, Magic Words and listening to the sounds in words. Towards the end of the term, we also started writing poems, using the same writing skills.

**Numeracy:** In Numeracy, we have learnt all about reading, writing, counting and making teen numbers. We have also been focusing on comparing collections, identifying which collection is smaller or larger.

We have continued to count to 20 forward and backwards. Students are having lots of fun playing games with numbers where they need to work out what comes before and after a given number.

July 2025

## Welcome to Edition 4, 2025 in 3/4!

Wow, can you believe it is nearly the end of Semester 1. The year is flying by just like our Grade 3/4 students learning. We have to give a round of applause to all the students for completing their assessments with focus, perseverance and a growth mindset attitude. Last week ahead team...make sure you enjoy your holidays. Get outside, help out at home, go on adventures, keep safe, relax, unwind, but most of all have fun.

### Literacy

In Reading, students have been deep diving into Non Fiction texts. Using our

mentor text The Big Book of Earth and Deadly Science, we have discovered the features, structure such as images, captions, descriptive language,



layout and text descriptions such as cause & effect and descriptions. We have analysed the effectiveness of the author's craft. What has been included, why and is it effective for the audience & purpose of the text. Students have loved learning a lot of interesting facts and information on a variety of topics.

### Numeracy

Angles, directions, location were so much fun! We loved working using grid references and following directions. We turned left, right, clockwise and anti clockwise. Compared to a right angle; what is an acute, obtuse and reflex angle? We estimated, compared and measured using a protractor. Finding angles in everyday life.

Algebra is about sequences and patterns. Finding unknown values and using inverse operations to show our working out. For example using addition to solve subtraction and multiplication solve division to work out balanced equations. Algebra is a mystery we have loved solving!!

July 2025

## Reading

In Reading, the students have been delving into a new mentor text called, 'Fire' by Jackie French and Bruce Whatley. They have been learning to understand what the author is implying, through the use of mood and tone in their word choices, images and punctuation, as well as identifying figurative language used and its meaning. Students have also been learning to make connections between 'Fire' and other texts on the same topic, text connections relating to the underlying theme, as well as making text to world connections, with real world events, such as, Black Saturday.

## Writing

In Writing, students have been delving into poetry, following the theme from reading, of natural disasters. Students have been learning to create poems with different rhyming patterns, free verse rhymes and reverse poems. This area of writing, has provided students the opportunity to express their creative side, through the use of powerful, emotive language and word choices, to create some truly wonderful poems. As a celebration, students published their favourite pieces and shared them at a 'poetry recital'.

### Maths

Students have been learning about balanced equations and finding unknown values in these equations. They have been identifying fact families and how this knowledge is used for inverse operations.

Students have also been learning about shape transformations. This has included investigated how to translate, rotate, reflect and enlarge shapes, including compound shapes.



### **Buddies**

In buddies this week, the Grade 6's worked alongside their buddy to use their imaginations to design, name and draw a creature. Their creatures were no ordinary creatures! They had superpowers and special abilities. Using this information and their creature as a character, the Grade 6's helped their buddies to write a short story, which contained a problem.

## Asian Region Expo

During Term 2, students have been exploring and researching about an Asian region country. They have spent countless hours in class and at home, creating slideshows, PowerPoint presentations and posters to display their findings, including country location, geographical feature, climate, festivals, food, demographics, population, natural disasters and more! All their efforts, were showcased at an expo for family, friends and the school community to see. We couldn't be prouder of their efforts!





## Sustainability in Art - Collage and Construction

This month in Art, students explored the creative process of Collage making, focusing on themes of nature and Sustainability. They used recycled materials, textured papers and items found in nature to design layered artworks. Inspired by the environment, students created artworks that represented plants, animals and ecosystems. Each artwork contributes to our class discussions about caring for our world.

**Prep** Students have recently finished their lady bug nature collage and have now moved onto designing and constructing egg carton monsters. They have loved designing, paintings, constructing and bringing their monster personalities to life.

Grade 1 & 2 Students have now finished their amazing water lilies pieces. Exploring Eric Carle's work, they created Snow Collages using their own printed paper. To complete our term, our young artists use brown paper bags and oil pastels to create an underground ant collage.





**Grade 3/4** Students have created native Australian bird collages by incorporating recycled plastics and different textured papers. We then used items found in nature, such as gumnuts, leaves and sticks to create insects.



**Grade 5/6** Students have now completed their environmental posters which will soon be displayed around the school. We then moved onto creating collages inspired by Louise Nevelson, using mixed media to create monochromatic designs.

We made dino eggs, 'build our own dinosaur', dino puppets, plate dinos etc. The children enjoy making all the different dinos.


#### Week 9- space/ aliens
